United Methodist Church Looks to Wowza® for Modernization of Worship

Overview

Founded in 1990, the United Methodist Church of the Resurrection is today one of America's fastest-growing churches, as well as one of the largest in the Methodist denomination. More than 16,000 people worship, study and serve at its four physical campuses in Missouri and Kansas, and through its online ministry.

The effect of the online ministry on the Church's growth is easy to see. The senior pastor floated the idea in 2007, and live webcast of Easter services that year attracted online viewership of about 200. Weekly streamed services began in November 2008, and by Easter 2009, the census was up to 1,600. At Christmas the same year, the Midwest was hammered with a blizzard that made it difficult or impossible for many people to get to church. As a result, the webcast audience grew to more than 3,500 people, and included not only the Church's own members but also people from churches elsewhere that had been forced to cancel services. Since then, online attendance has steadily grown and now makes up about 15 percent of total weekly attendance.

In 2009, average weekly worship attendance was about 7,600. For the first eight months of 2010, the average audience was about 9,000 – almost a 20 percent increase due in large part to the growth in the online ministry. As the burgeoning online viewership continued, the church was faced with a number of issues.
